#### Louise Martin

After reading Music and English Literature at Sheffield University and following a year of volunteering on adult literacy and community projects, Louise Martin spent eight years teaching in the very active music department of a large Sheffield comprehensive school. Returning to Edinburgh, she was awarded a postgraduate MMus from the University of Edinburgh, specialising in Ethnomusicology. Subsidiary studies in Music in the Community led to placements in prisons with adults with special learning needs and people with disabilities, and for the Muzički Centar Pavarotti (Mostar) in Bosnia-Herzegovina and Croatia.

Louise now works as a freelance musician/animateur in a variety of contexts, including creative music residencies for the Highlands Council and East Lothian Council, sessions with Artlink, music workshops for corporate team-building events and with primary school children, and as musical director of Edinburgh's Stockbridge and New Town Community Orchestra.

In November 2007 she led an open taster session run by the BBC SSO for over one hundred adult amateur musicians and was subsequently engaged as conductor/animateur for the Merchant Sinfonia. She also teaches part-time at the University of Edinburgh and Napier University, and works part-time managing music education projects for the Scottish Chamber Orchestra.

## Jamie MacDougall

Jamie MacDougall has established himself as one of the country's most versatile singers and performers. Since 2001 he has been the voice of classical music on BBC Radio Scotland (Classics Unwrapped) and he has also moved into television, having annually presented BBC Proms in the Park Glasgow. He continues to tour with Caledon – Scotland's Tenors (of which he is a founding member) and recently returned to Berlin with their new show 'Whirlin in Berlin', a recording of which was released on DVD and CD last November. They have also taken the show to the USA, to Canada, Mexico, the Dominican Republic, as well as to various venues in England and Wales. On the solo front Jamie recently returned to London's Royal Albert Hall for a performance of Handel's Messiah with the Royal Choral Society. Next weekend he will be the presenter for the BBC SSO's listenherel events, here at City Halls.

## BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra

The BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra is widely regarded as one of Europe's leading orchestras and enjoys an enviable position as a cultural flagship for the BBC and for Scotland. Formed in Edinburgh in December 1935, the orchestra now appears in venues across Scotland, is a core part of the BBC Proms, performs regularly at the Edinburgh International Festival and is in demand at major festivals throughout the world.

The BBC SSO is permanently based at Glasgow City Halls, and each season it also appears in other Scottish towns and cities. As Scotland's leading supporter of new music the orchestra has established strong links with local communities through an innovative learning programme. Abroad, it has appeared in many of the great musical centres of Europe and has toured the USA, South America and been twice to China, most recently in May 2008. Donald Runnicles became the BBC SSO's Chief Conductor in September 2009.
